

CHALLENGE

The August Challenge was **Plates**, **Platters & Saucers**. We had plenty of entries in all three categories.

Anton Bosch took Beginners honors with a big leaf maple plate finished with Danish oil, buff & wax.



Jack Stumpf won in the Intermediate category, with one of his three platters: two of maple, one of walnut, all finished with Maloof's







Scott Johnston took Advanced place with his art platter of bigleaf maple, finished with semi gloss lacquer and black glaze. He also presented a redwood saucer finished with satin lacquer and black glaze.





Other entries:

Tony Thiessen had two platters, one of walnut, the other ash, both finished with friction polish.





Pete Carta had three entries - a small plate of ash finished with lacquer, a platter also of ash, oil finish, and a mahogany plate with friction polish. **Willie Hamburger** showed a segmented bowl of various woods, lacquer finish.



Jim Schopper had a Hollywood juniper platter, semi gloss lacquer, while **Larry Margules** had a deep plate of guilted maple, also lacquer finish.



Fernando Vilchis had an oak platter finished with tung oil & varnish, and **Henry Koch** a sapele plate finished with wax.





John Janssen had one of his commemorative plates - material was melaleuca?? finished with polycrylic.



Steve Cassidy had a silver maple plate finished with Briwax, and **Ron Shaffer** a mystery wood platter with clear coat.





Sandy Huse had some flying saucers in her "Escape from Area 51", constructed from a bowling ball, misc. wood, wire, fimo, glass & plastic.



This one had to be photographed "in situ", as the globe could not be moved (I guess Archimedes and his lever weren't available)

SHOW AND TELL

We had quite a few items in Show and Tell: **Steve Veenstra** had two large walnut bowls finished with butcher block oil.





Tony Thiessen showed a set of 6 8"salad bowls of ash, finished with beeswax, while **Bill Loitz** had a 12" salad bowl, also of ash. Finish was Maloof oil & acrylic.





Carey Caires had a "small" bowl (actually, pretty large for her) of African citrus, and a set of sycamore and purple heart bottle stoppers. Lacquer finish on the purple heart, Mylands and buffed carnauba on the sycamore. **Pete Carta** showed a small natural edge bowl of ash, oil finish.





James Hurst had a vase of blue gum eucalyptus, finished with Mylands and Beall buffed, while John Janssen had some salt and pepper shakers as well as a candle holder, all of camphor finished with butcher block finish & polycrylic.





A couple of *Beads of Courage* boxes, the first by **Henry Koch**, made of oak and mahogany, sanding sealer finish, and the second by "unknown" (no name on the tag) of olive with friction polish and sealer.





Jim Schopper also showed a Beads of Courage box this one of poplar, along with 2 lidded boxes of Hollywood juniper, all finished with lacquer.





James Hurst had a couple of items. The first was a carbide tipped gun-boring bit he purchased used, and then adapted with a morse taper attachment and a port for running compressed air through it. These adaptations were done with the help of our Treasurer, Bob Devoe. He also had a gouge handle he turned for Bob of maple finished with Mylands.



PRESENTATION

Bob Clark gave a detailed presentation on lathe maintenance and restoration, and how to install electronic speed controls. He talked about what to look for in used equipment, as well as a pretty detailed discussion on horsepower, voltage, amperage, etc. He also provided information on motor frequency, sources for parts, and showed how to set up and install modern speed controllers on your equipment.
